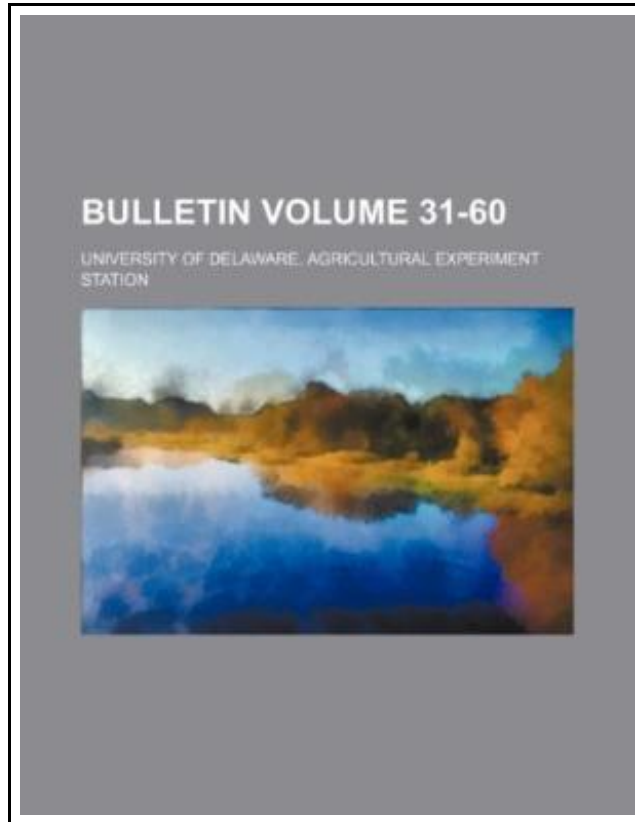

In June, 1898, the rainfall was such that the seed germinated quickly and had ideal conditions for rapid growth during its early days, while in June, 1897, the smaller precipitation and lower temperature were less favorable to growth. In July and August the chief important difference was in the higher temperature of 1898, while in September, 1898 has the advantage again in a fair rainfall, whereas 1897 had a decided deficiency. Our weather records show that during the past ten years there have been only two when we might not have expected a good crop of cow-peas.
